Typhoon Haiyan The Second Tunic Responds

Two weeks after Typhoon Haiyan brought destruction to large portions of central Philippines, The Second Tunic-supported workers Nelson Malaque,

Soriano Catulay, Jan Tampac, and Jermane Cabey assisted with the distribution of food and basic relief items.

On December 6, 2013, they took a 40' container of building materials and supplies. They are focusing their relief efforts in Dulag, a community of about 375 families. To begin the process of
